What is land grabbing?

- Foreign companies and state investment funds buy or lease agricultural land
- Over 1000 hectare

The Global Landgrab

- In recent years 50 million hectare of land agricultural land is grabbed
 - Half of it in Africa
- Used to food export, agrofuels and treefarms (also nature conservation)

Why in deveveloping countries?

- Cheap labour force
- Cheap land
- Low taxes and tariffs, few expectations from investor

Whats the problem?

- Land often claimed to be empty are in fact being used by small-scale farmers and pastoralists
- “Race to the bottom”

GMO

- Genetically modified organisms
- Change in plants hereditary material
- Commercial GMOs owned by mainly 5 companies

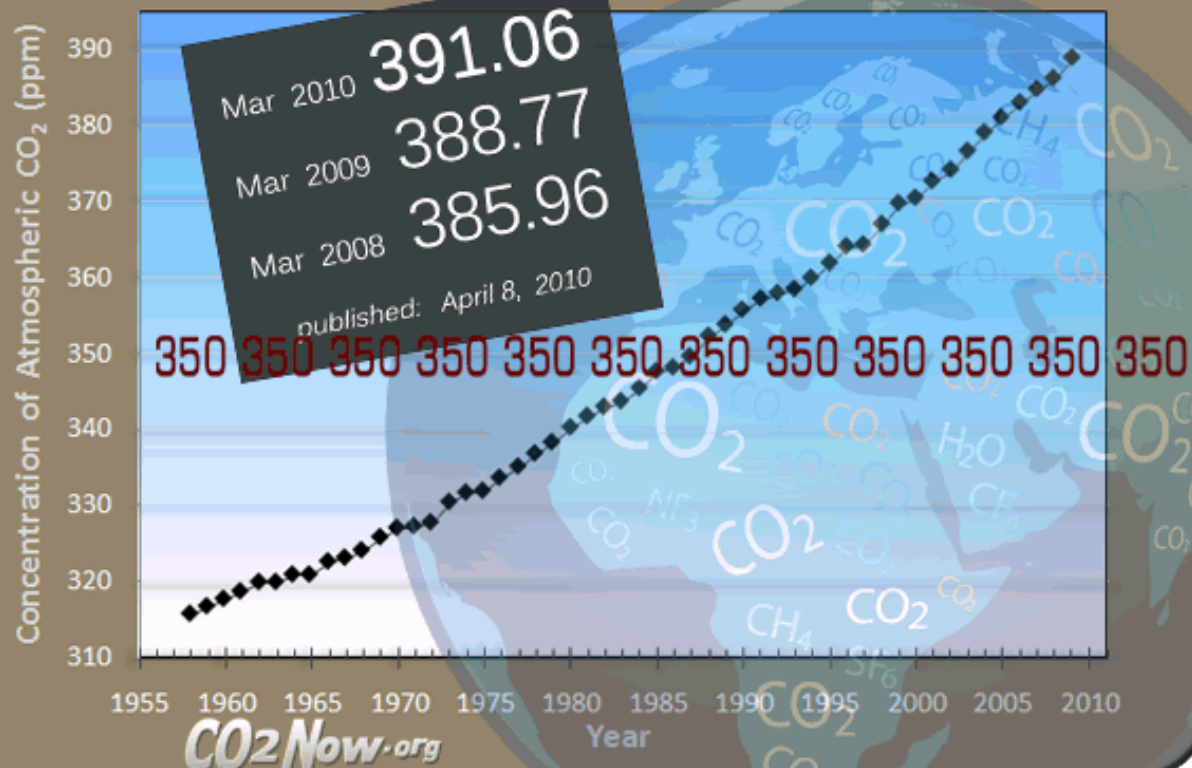
- James Hansen NASA researcher: we must stop global warming at 1,5 C
